Bursaries – Several bursaries are available to help towards the costs of the meeting, these may include both travel and registration fees or the registration fee alone. For the 39th Annual Scientific Meeting of the BSTP, reduced registration fees are available as well as bursaries. Priority will be given to individuals working within an “early career” environment, for example: stipendiary MSc/PhD students or researchers studying/working within a relevant scientific field, and veterinary pathology residents at a recognised institution working towards a professional qualification wishing to gain more experience within the field of toxicological pathology.

Applications for bursaries or reduced registration fees are welcome from interested members and non-members of the BSTP. The awarding of any funding will be at the discretion of the BSTP Council.

The BSTP is keen for early career attendees to submit a poster on a piece of work with which they have been involved. For this reason, the poster requirements are as broad and non-restrictive as possible. There is no requirement to follow the traditional Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results and Conclusion outline if attendees do not wish to do so. The work presented in a poster does not have to have been previously published in a peer reviewed journal.

A prize will be awarded at the meeting for the best poster.
