POSTER GUIDELINES

Poster Presentations

- Poster boards are 1m wide x 2m high (portrait). Posters should be no more than 90cm wide and 180cm high. Size A0 posters are most typical.
- The posters will be displayed in The Chairmans Suite, The Grand, York where the exhibition, lunch and refreshments will take place. Please put your poster up on any free board.
- Posters will be displayed throughout the duration of the conference; you may wish to accompany your poster during the refreshment and lunch times, most likely this is when delegates will pursue posters.
- All posters must be removed by 17.00 on Friday 15th November 2024. Any posters that have not been reclaimed will be taken down and removed from the venue.
- Should you have any queries relating to your poster at the conference, please go to the Hg3 Conference registration desk located in the foyer.
- Velcro can be provided by the organisers on the day. No drawing pins, staples, sticky pads or any other form of adhesive should be used on the poster boards provided.
- When preparing your poster, please remember that your message must be legible and clearly stated. The purpose of your poster is to present your work in a form that is easily understood and is simple to read.

Top Tips for producing posters

Please follow these simple guidelines for preparing an effective poster:

- Keep the poster informative and concise. Do not overload it with information.
- A poster should represent a 'snapshot' of your work – show the most interesting aspects of your work with both text and high-quality images, graphs and charts.
- It may be useful to design your poster around the following headings:
 - Introduction (or aims/objectives)
 - Methods
 - Results
 - Conclusions (or Summary)
 - Reference list if applicable
- Your title, affiliation and authors should be clearly represented at the top of your poster. You may wish to list funding sources within your poster also (not necessarily at the top).
- Your poster should be eye-catching; it should draw people towards it.
- Avoid clashing colours.
- Keep the text formatting consistent throughout.
- Font 18 can easily be read from a distance. Use larger size for the headings. Headings should be in bold type.
